Aiea Rams' sparkling 13-0 victory over 2 Step Inn at Lanakila field high-lighted 125# barefoot tussles Sunday, September 18, as the Citywide-Palama league completed its second week of play. Three hard-fought deadlocks were forced into the background as the rural squad's display of gridiron power gave it the top spot in West Section standings.

Halfback Saburo Nadai was the whole show for Aiea, packing the ball into pay territory 35 yards through tackle in the opening minutes, and again on a 25 yard jaunt in the third quarter.

Ewa Plantation battled Frankie Cab to a 6-6 tie at Castle field in the first half of a twin-bill. Ewa tallied in the second quarter when Shimizu, playing end, blocked a punt and raced 25 yards to a touchdown. Tackle Matsumiya recovered an Ewa fumble in the end zone late in the last period for Franie Cab's six points.

Takai Electrical stopped Akana Ramblers 13-7 on two intercepted passes in the other half of the double attraction. Serizawa snagged a flank pass and dashed 60 yards for the first touchdown in the second quarter, and Yanagi speared one for 25 yards and a score in the fourth stanza. Sakamoto registered for the Ramblers after a sustained drive in the third period.

Mike Shizuru's Rissho A.C. earned a 6-2 squeeze over Barbecue Inn at Cartwright park when Freitas faked a pass and sped 50 yards to a score in the last quarter. Earlier in the same period, Barbecue Inn had stopped Elmo Tomita, fleet Rissho half, in the end zone for a safety.

The defending-champion Moililis were held to their second tie in as many starts, this time 7-7 by Diamond Packers. Smile Cafe and Waialae played to a scoreless tie in a spirited game to lower the curtain on the day's schedule.
