THREE RECORDS BROKEN IN B.C.A. SWIM FINALS

Three Palama records were broken and another tied in the Settlement finals of the B.C.A. Swimming pentathlon held Tuesday, April 16, in the Westside pool.

Buster Lee created a new mark in the 14-15 Year Class 20-yard Breaststroke by negotiating the distance in 10.1 seconds as Mitsuto Tarutani smashed the 18-20 Year Class 20-yard Backstroke record with a 10.0 effort, and tied Paul Silva's 30.4 criterion for the 60-yard Freestyle, while Henry Chang broke the 18-20 Year Class 20-yard Breaststroke standard by hanging up a new mark of 9.4 seconds.

Emerging as Settlement champions were Georges Gilbert, 12-13 Year Class; Buster Lee, 14-15 Year Class; Yoshihiko Oshiro, 16-17 Year Class; and Mitsuto Tarutani, 18-20 Year Class. Their individual achievements are listed below.

The regulation game ended 2-2, and the ensuing struggle for the victory kept a huge crowd on edge throughout. Buto went the entire distance for the winners, while Lopez and Rodrigues handled the pitching assignment for the Braves.

Honolulu Chop Sui gained undisputed leadership of Section "A" by nipping Palama A.C. 8-7. Vilai Sua's last inning homer accounted for the victory. Kaiulani scored a mild upset by taking Waiaka 7-5 to throw Section "B" into a triple tie. Phantom A.C. continued to set the pace in Section "C" by virtue of a default by Castle "B" in a scheduled game.

Theresa 13-2 behind fine chucking by Collins and slashing hitting. The Chans will tangle Honolulu Chop Sui for the section championship this Sunday, April 28. Castle "A" walloped the Pal Babes 17-1 to tie Kaiulani and Waiaka for the Section "B" leadership with three victories in four starts. Royal Malts hung on to a slim chance for Section "C" laurels by coming through with a scintillating 6-2 victory over Ueno Shoten.

The Vagabonds handed Lakimela its fourth straight setback by a 14-9 count, as the Akepos whipped Desha Lane 6-2 to end hostilities for the day.
