Venereal Disease Clinic

During the year 1934 the Venereal Disease Clinic at Palama Settlement has treated 347 cases of syphilis and 469 cases of gonorrhoea, totaling 816. 391 of these were under treatment January 1st, 1934, 330 were new cases admitted during the year, and 95 were old patients who decided to renew treatment.

The direct cost of the Clinic, exclusive of overhead, rent, janitor service, light, power, water, accounting and supervision, amounted to \$7,118.94. Palama received from the Board of Supervisors the sum of \$7200 for this work. The average cost per treatment, of which there were 12,241, was \$.58 and the average cost per patient, of which there were 816, was \$8.72. The entire amount collected from the patients receiving this care was \$413.29.

A large proportion of the cases treated were individuals under the care of public or private institutions - the Juvenile Court, City and County Jail, Military Police and the Social Service Bureau. Of the 464 patients on hand December 31, 1934, 22% were under 12

years of age, 14% 12-19 years of age, 32% 20-29 years of age, 24% 30-44 years of age, and 7% 45 years and over.

Mothers' Health Clinic

This clinic began its fourth year of service in July 1934. Under the general direction of the Medical Director, it is conducted by Dr. Muriel Cass, who holds two clinics weekly from 1 to 4 P.M. at the Settlement. She is assisted by a full-time social worker, a full-time clerk-interpreter, a part-time nurse and a part-time attendant. The office is open daily from 3 to 4 for interviews, appointments and purchase of supplies. Occasionally, as opportunity or need arose, clinics have been held in rural areas or in the less accessible parts of the city.

During the year, 110 clinics were held; 665 new patients visited the clinic, making together with the revisits of old patients, 3,085 visits to the clinic, 3,139 follow-ups by home visits, letters or cards.

The staff of Palama's Nursing Department consists of a Director, a teaching supervisor, 2 field supervisors and 17 field nurses. The staff of the Bureau of Public Health Nursing of the Board of Health, so far as Honolulu is concerned, consists of 8 field nurses, and a supervisor; the Bureau's Director has these and 27 other nurses under her direction. A completely generalized nursing service is provided.

In 1934 Palama Settlement nurses, F.E.R.A. nurses, and students worked 33,997 hours in the various activities listed below.

KINDERGARTEN AND SCHOOL HEALTH SUPERVISION

Public health nurses visited the schools and kindergartens regularly in order to assist the school authorities in promoting the health of the children and to aid in the prevention and control of communicable disease. Standing Orders approved by the Territorial Medical Association (Oct. 1930) were followed when first aid or other treatments were necessary. Treatments other than that of emergency nature were stopped in September 1933.

Basing the infant mortality rate upon 24 deaths of infants under 1 year and 2289 infants under one on the registers of the conferences during 1934, the rate is 10.4 per 1000 live births. It is recognized that few infants are registered at the conferences during the first month of life.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

For the third year the present Director of the Nursing Department had charge of the Public Health Nursing Course at the University of Hawaii in which 10 graduate nurses were enrolled. Six senior students from Queen's Hospital each had two months' field experience with us as part of their nursing education.

Staff education has been carried on continuously with the nurses taking a more active part in planning and participating in group meetings.

MATERNITY SERVICE

Our maternity service in the home includes instruction in health habits, nutrition and other factors influencing the health of the prospective mother, preparation for the baby, actual care of mother and baby after delivery, or instruction to the family and general supervision. The prenatal conference service includes periodic examination by a physician, taking of temperature, pulse, respiration and blood pressure, urinalysis and group instruction in hygiene for mother and baby. Demonstrations show desirable foods, clothes, toilet tray and other equipment including materials for home delivery.

During 1934 prenatal conferences were held weekly at Palama Settlement, Queen's Hospital, Kapiolani Maternity and Gynecological Hospital, and from August to December, at St. Francis' Hospital. Palama nurses were in charge assisted at Queen's and St. Francis by staff and student nurses and at the others by nurses from the Bureau of Public Health Nursing. Physicians at the Settlement and Kapiolani were paid by Palama. At the other hospitals house physicians and internes maintained the medical service.

Conclusion

Approximately 2,119 different girls and women have benefited by the activities sponsored by the Girls' Recreation Department at Palama Settlement. A total then of 4,119 girls and women have come to Palama for recreation during the year 1934.

The Girls' Department has sponsored 45 various activities at which the total attendance has been 11,000.
