MUSIC SCHOOL

MUSIC CLASSES: Spring Term - 17 weeks -- Registration from January 21-26, 1957. 7 weeks Summer and 17 weeks Fall Term. Term begins on January 28, 1957.

FOR CHILDREN:

Classes Piano, voice, violin, viola, band and orchestral Instruments are offered. Teachers are graduates of both mainland and local music schools. One semester of general music following which beginners are usually taught in classes of 2 to 4 students. Private instruction is given when the student is ready. Instrumental classes are 1/2 hour long. Group rate - \$25 per semester, 17-week semester. Private lessons - \$35 per semester. Musicianship and theory classes are offered free to enrolled music students. Classes are scheduled at the convenience of teacher and pupil. Students from 9th and 12th grades taking piano lessons are eligible for DPI credit.

Palama-Kiwanis Band This 50 piece Band is co-sponsored by Palama Settlement and the Kiwanis Club of Honolulu. Open to boys and girls. Students of band instruments are eligible to join the Beginners or the Advanced Band. There is a small fee for band membership. Parents are invited to join the parent's organization of the Band.

String Ensemble As soon as the fundamentals are acquired by beginning string students, they are placed in string ensemble classes leading to a string orchestra. No additional fee for these classes.

Choral Singing A children's chorus meets every Saturday morning. Older age groups may meet on an arranged schedule. Age range 7-12 years old.

For ADULTS

Classes Same as for children, *except* for the fee-\$35 per semester. Lessons are once a week for 1/2 hour.

Choral Conducting Seminar Classes for potential or experienced choral and choir directors are held once a week. DPI credit for teachers.
