

MUSIC SCHOOL MONTHLY REPORT

August, 1950

August 18th was the last day of the summer term. The term was climaxed by a program presented by the students. Featured on the program were a few new students who had entered at the beginning of the summer term. They were presented to demonstrate to those present what had been accomplished in a summer's time. The Little Glee Club composed of children of the primary grades made their first appearance. The piano ensemble group played also for the first time. Various other classes performed activities to show the range of subjects covered in the school. Approximately one hundred and sixty people were present.

About twenty of the music school students enjoyed a picnic at Hanauma Bay at the close of the summer term. Miss Hope Troyer, faculty member, has returned after a year's leave of absence. She had been studying in Paris under Darius Milhaud.

Registration week was from August 21 to 25th. This was put ahead to allow late comers to register before the school term actually started. Registration was small compared to that of the summer term.

The fall term will begin on September 11th. The staff has staggered its vacation during the vacation period between terms so that there will always be someone at the music school. During this time the piano requirements, actually a course of study, were studied and revised by faculty members.

On one of the very last days of August the music school office was burglarized. The locked desk drawer was forced open; some money, students awards and class supplies were stolen.
