shine on brother shine on.

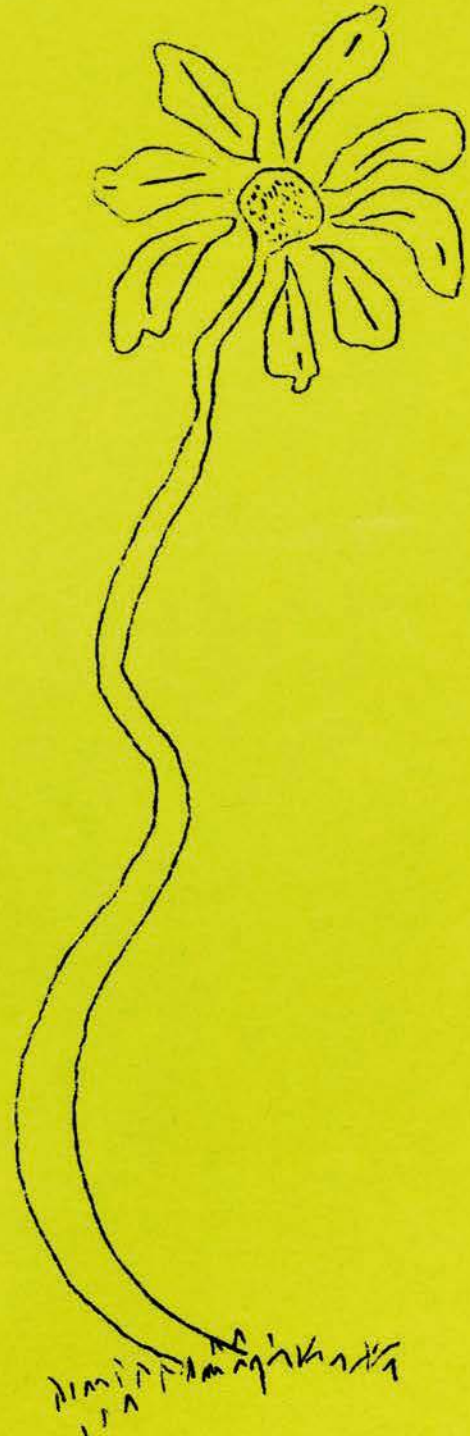
