Date

During the month of April several classes of 4 (group piano) were divided into classes of two. Their three month periods as groups of four had terminated. In two cases individuals were given private lessons due to problems of adjustment to group study. On the whole the enrollment was very stable for the month. The waiting list was 21 as of the end of April, most of whom are children of high or intermediate school age hence cannot be excused early to fill a few vacant periods between 1:15 and 2:30.

The May Day program organized by a group of children from the dramatics club accounted for an increase in the number of non-fee children using the facilities for the month. Over half of these children are new to the settlement and do not yet have membership cards. The project was considered successful from the point of view of following through on a project conceived and carried through by the children themselves. Some mistakes were made in supervision which are noted for the future. The income from the luau totalled \$81.00 before expenses and a few refunds. \$15.00 was spend on additional food for the luau: \$15.00 was spent two days later for a dinner for 25 children, performers of the May Day show who did not get anything to eat at the luau. The balance has been deposited in the club account. A final figure will be reported as soon as the last few refunds are taken care of.

The community chorus was suspended for April and May to make way for the series of Friday night recitals. The Saturday night T.S.C. Instrumental group continues to meet and is working out an arrangement to join forces with part of the children's
