Hawaii's young people will star in the Festival of Music being held at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday in Farrington auditorium. The Friends of Palama club is sponsoring the programs to benefit the Palama Settlement scholarship programs.

The Roosevelt a cappella chorus and the McKinley concert band will share the stage Saturday night. On Friday, the Ryukyu Ongaku Kyokai will play and dance the music of Okinawa in their stead.

Other portions of the program will be the same on both evenings. Soprano Lorraine Pokipala and the Settlement children's chorus will sing folk songs of Hawaii and the Pacific nations. Kamokila Campbell, Hawaii's kamaaina storyteller, will relate some little known legends. One tells how the black sands of Kalapana came to be; the other deals with the sacred temple drums of Kupa, on Molokai. Pele Pukui will accompany Mrs. Campbell, enacting the legend in dance. Kaupena Wong will serve as chanter.

Friendship House, a drama of Palama Settlement's contribution to the youth of the community, will also be presented on both evenings. It was performed last year for the first time, and proved so popular that it is being repeated this year.
