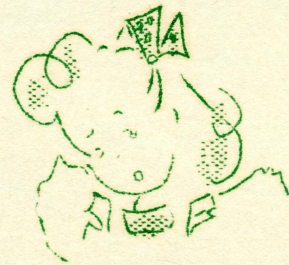

Something to Cook

Magic Taffy

2/3 cup sugar 3 tablespoon
2 cups maple-flavored syrup
3 tablespoon vinegar

Put butter in kettle, add sugar and syrup and stir until sugar dissolves, then boil until brittle when tried in cold water. Add vinegar just before taking from fire. Pour into buttered pan. When cool enough to handle, pull with fingertips--do not squeeze in hands. Cut in small pieces and put on buttered plate.
