Coach Harry Murakami's John Hancock giant-killers came through with another spectacular upset victory in the Citywide-Palama 130# barefoot football league by kalsomining Mike Shizuru's defending-champion Charley's Place 2-0 in the most consequential tussle of an eight-game schedule Sunday, September 22. A safety in the second quarter enabled John Hancock to hand Charley's Place its first setback in two years of campaigning.

Moiliili Blues and Hinode Kai battled to a 6-6 dealock to leave East Section standings tangled. Hinode Kai led all the way until the wanning minutes when Moiliili came to life and tied the score on a pass, Nakano to Murakami. Diamond Packers whipped Waialae 7-0 behind fine ball-toting by Ernest Pacheco. Kaimuki and Primo Cubs were unable to strike paydirt and were forced to leave the field scoreless after four bruising quarters.

Masuto Fujii's Tony Gora nipped a scrappy Hui Eleu outfit 3-0 at Castle Field to assume the driver's seat in West Section standings. Joe Goshima's place-kick from the 20-yard stripe with four minutes of play remaining in the ball game spelled victory for Tony Gora. Sensational punting by Goshima and Rapoza kept the charging Hui Eleu barefooters at bay at crucial moments. Ewa kept within striking distance of the league-leader by taking Waipahu 2-0 in the final moments of the game when a blocked punt rolled out of the end zone.

Aiea handed Charlie Chan its third straight defeat 6-0, when Ako recovered a punt blocked by Muraki and raced 10 yards to a touchdown. A recovered fumble on the two-yard line in the quarter paved the way for Lido Cafe's mild upset over a favored Kalihi-Kai eleven. Score was 6-0.
