## 1988 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Neighborhood Development coordinated four major community events with the support of staff and volunteers from such diverse groups as the Optimist Club, McKinley and Farrington High School students, Mayor Wright Mothers Group, and the Kamehameha Lions Club. The Mayor Wright Homes Residents' Association, which continues to function with support services from Palama Settlement, was the recipient of several distinguished awards including the First Lady's Outstanding Volunteer Award for 1988 for the most innovative and successful community program.

The Pakolea Program celebrated it's 20th anniversary with a first place trophy won by the Junior Pee Wee Cheerleaders in the annual Pop Warner Competition. Nearly 400 children participated in the football, basketball and Summer Enrichment Programs.

All Programs utilized our Learning Center. Under the direction of our new educator, planning for two new projects began. These are: 1) Players Who Care - sports teams from local private high schools who tutor our Pakolea youth and 2) a greatly expanded Computer Center which should reach fruition in 1989.

Almost 100,000 people used our Recreation facilities in 1988 including four volleyball leagues, a professional wrestling organization, adult aerobics classes and basketball teams made up of a variety of local groups. Learn-to-swim classes were inaugurated in conjunction with the After School Recreation Program.

The 1988 year began strong for Corbett House with a full house of teenage residents in the shelter home. Changes in Family Court policies for detention of status offenders affected referrals which dropped substantially but the program continued to offer critical support and service to its residents. Along with their school activities, the girls also broadened themselves through such volunteer activities as working with handicapped youth and tutoring children in Palama's Summer Enrichment Program.

The In-Community Treatment Program had a Summer Hawaiian Project that coupled weekly instructional classes with experiential activities including outings to the Bishop Museum, Waimea Park, Camp Palama Uka, Lyon Arboretum, Queen Emma Summer Palace and Haleiwa Nature Hike.

Major renovations were made to our gym roof and floor thanks to a donation by the Strong-Carter Foundation. Improvements were added to the interior of the Corbett House girls' residence as well as to our Palama-Uka Mountain camp. A water system was installed at the camp enabling longer-term use and larger groups to enjoy the 150 acre outdoor facility.

We are proud of all our programs and services which are offered under a qualified staff of professional and paraprofessionals in Social Work, Education, Public Health and Human Service fields.

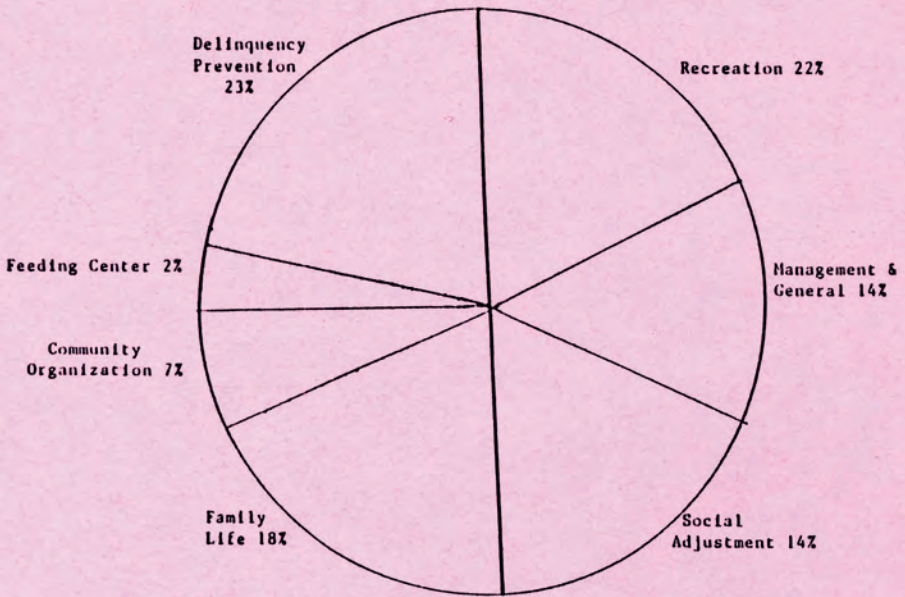

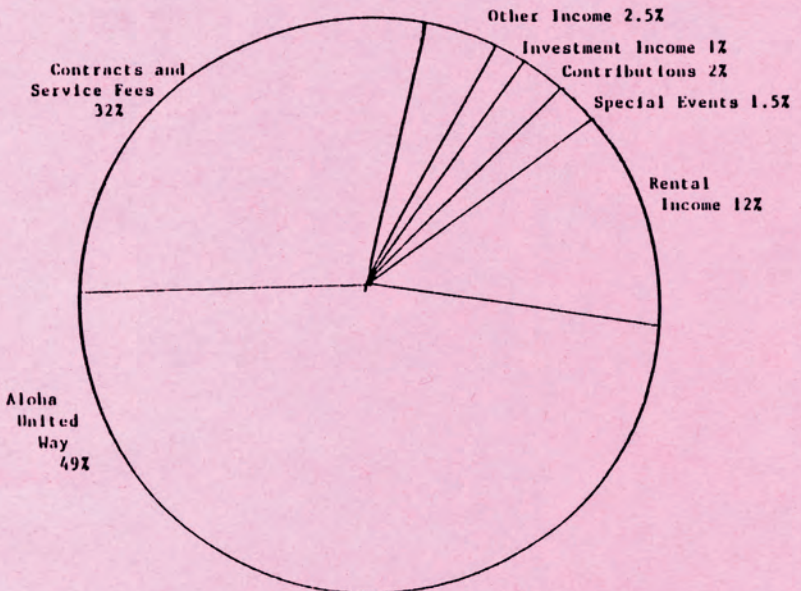
