MRS. MATTISON RELEASES STATISTICS FOR PALAMA BRANCH LIBRARY

Mrs. Myrtle C. Mattison, Branch Librarian, has released to Ka-Palama statistics of the Palama Branch Library for the fiscal year beginning July 1939 and ending June 1940. The report reveals that a grand total of 60,341 books were borrowed during the 12-month period, 40,670 Fiction and 19,671 Non-Fiction. According to Mrs. Mattison's figures, Juvenile borrowers outnumber the Adults at a 3-1 ratio, registering 3,167 borrowers to 1,027 for the older readers. Complete statistics are listed below:
