CITYWIDE-PAL BAREFOOTERS OPEN ACTION SUN

The 1939 Citywide-Palama barefoot football circuit, set at 130 pounds by popular demand, will shed its wraps this Sunday morning, September 10, with six tussles scheduled on city and rural griditons. Fourteen teams are primed for the kickoff, but only an even dozen will see action in the league inaugurals, as Hinode Kai and Waipahu drew byes. Play is divided into two leagues of seven teams each, with sectional champions tangling for the Oahu title October 29 at the Honolulu Stadium.

All fourteen aggregations are wellcoached and evenly-matched, giving promise to a great season. East Section teams are Loo's Place, Smile Cafe, Moiliili Nesei, Lido Cafe, Waialae YMA, Hinode Kai, and Hui Makai. Playing under the West Section banner are Ewa, Akebono Kai, Charlie Chan, Aiea, Kyodo Kai, Waipahu, and Pal Babes. Competition looms keener in West Section pairings, with the three country squads, Ewa, Aiea, and Waipahu, forming a tough clique for Masuto Fujii's star-studded Kyodo Kai crew to smash. Loo's Place, coached by Mike Shizuru the dy namic headman of Palama's territorial champions of a few years ago, appears to be the class of East Section.

Playing fields selected by the league directors are Cartwright and Crane Parks for the East Section league, and Castle, Lanakila, Aiea, Waipahu, and Ewa fields for the West circuit. Incidentally, the rural outfits will play most of their games on home gridirons, necessitating traveling for the other members of West Section.

Hui Makai will open the season against Smile Cafe at 9:00 a.m. at Cartwright field in an East Section tussle, while West Section teams will skirmish at 10:00 o'clock on three different gridirons. The playing times for this Sunday follow:


PALAMA TRANQUIL AS SCHOOL-ROOMS BECKON

PALAMA 110# CAGE LEAGUE OPENS THURSDAY

The 1939 Palama 110# basketball league will swing into action Thursday evening, September 7, with a fast twin-bill in the Settlement gym. Raymond Choo's Hui Aliis are scheduled to open the season against Hui Imua at 7:00 p.m., with Tommy Wong's Pirates "A" engaging Maggie's Inn at 7:45 o'clock.

Defending-champion B.K. Yamamoto heads a formidable nine-team field in the 1939 race, with Hui Aliis, Hui Imua, Pirates "A", Pirates "B", Toyo A.C., Maggie's Inn Castle A.C., and Raiders comprising the league roster.

The circuit will operate on Tuesday and Thursday evenings for the next eight weeks with twin-attractions offered on playing nights. Inaugurated last year by the league sponsors as a preliminary to their popular 120 and 135 pound leagues, the lightweight competition has stirred up so much enthusiasm and interest in the game that it now ranks on a par with the heavier conferences.
