RECREATION DEPARTMENT OPENS FALL SCHEDULE

The Palama Recreation Department will open its Fall Activity Program Monday, September 16, with a wide variety of recreational activities in both the Boys' and Girls' Divisions. Membership privileges in both divisions are attractively presented in mimeographed leaflets which have been distributed among the neighborhood schools.

A varied program of club, craft, Scouting, and physical activities for boys of all age groups will offer each member in the Boys' Recreation Division an opportunity to choose the type of recreation which appeals most to him. Special emphasis will be placed on clubs, with the purpose of interesting every boy in becoming a member of some Palama club.

The Girls' Division will offer Swimming, Sports, Vocational, Craft, and Recreational, and Club Activities besides membership privileges in special events and cooperative activities in its Fall Program.

Membership rates for a whole year are exceedingly low in both divisions, ranging from fifty cents for Mites to \$3.00 for Adults.

Larry Akau's star-studded Tuxedo Shop outfit scored a brilliant 45-26 victory over ACA Juniors in the first game of the opening triple-bill. Clem Ching, former Mick star, accounted for 17 of Tuxedo's points to lead all scorers for the day.

Rookie halfback Nakano sparked Moiliili's great victory by striking paydirt on three occassions on sensational runs. Hinode Kai blasted John Hancock 13-0 at Cartwright field after a hard battle.

Diamond Packers took Kaimuki for a 12-0 ride at Crane Park to stamp themselves formidable contenders for the East Section Alex Sandwich Shop whipped Goo's Goldentitle. Masuto Fujii's star-studded Tony Gora crew, formerly Kyodo Kai, West Section champion, experienced difficulty in subduing a tough Lido Cafe squad coached by Big Head Kanae. The Purple Raiders succumbed 13-0 after a hard battle which featured brilliant ball-toting by Tony Gora's Larry Nii and Reggie Goshima. Waipahu squashed Kalihi Kai 18-6 at Waipahu to draw the curtain on the opening schedule.
