FACULTY RECITAL - Nov. 22nd

The faculty of Palama Settlement Music School will present a recital on Saturday evening, November 22nd to which all students, their parents and friends are invited.

Those performing will include Mr. Ronald Tarr, head of the piano faculty, Miss Dora Ah Chan, Miss Nora Matsumura and Carol Yamaguchi all of the piano faculty. Miss Joanna Noble cellist will also perform with Mr. Tarr in music for piano and cello.

The recital will be held in the Music School Auditorium at 7:30 p.m.

Refreshments will be served and parents and students will have the opportunity to meet their teachers at the level of their main interest as performing musicians.

A portion of the program will consist of the performance of music used in the first several years of instruction with explanations by the teachers. This will be similar to last year's program which was well received.

The remainder of the program will consist of selections of advanced works from the concert repertory.

HAWAII'S FIRST FOLK MUSIC FESTIVAL OF THE PACIFIC NATIONS will be held in Honolulu during Easter vacation week, March 30 through April 4, 1959.

A series of seminars in the study of folk songs of Hawaii, Japan, Korea, China, the Philippines, the Pacific Islands and the United States will be held during that week. This will appeal to students of music and teachers, musicians and others who enjoy folk music.

Internationally famous experts in folk music will be brought to Hawaii from Japan and from the United States to assist with the teaching during the week-long festival.



Local experts in folk song music of the many nationalities of Hawaii's people will also assist with the teaching.

There will be two great concerts at the Waikiki Shell at the climax of the Festival in which many local groups will be seen and heard in the colorful folk songs and dances of the nationalities. The Palama

Settlement Children's Chorus will join with the Stevenson Intermediate School Chorus, the Honolulu Community Chorus and full symphony orchestra in the presentation of SONG OF THE FORESTS - a large choral-orchestral work never before fully performed in America. The work was composed by the contemporary Dmitri Shostakovich and a new English translation has been prepared.

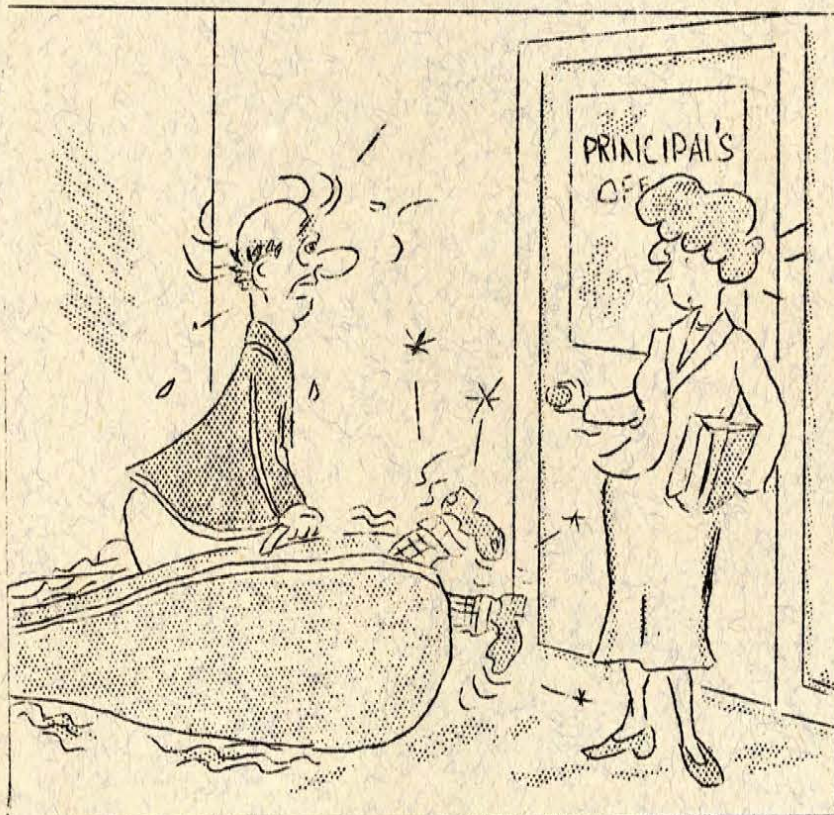

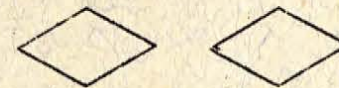
