RIVERSIDERS UPSET MONARCHS IN 135# TILT

A hard-fighting Riversider quintet scored a brilliant 24-19 upset over the defending-champion McInerny Monarchs in the feature of a 135# cage quadruple-bill Sunday, December 4, in the Palama gym to gain the leadership of Section "A" with four straight victories and no losses. Ewa Buccaneers won its first game in four starts on a default from the Leaders.

The Riversider victory automatically places them in the round-robin series between the two leading teams of each section immediately following the end of the regular schedule. Tommy Wong's Pirates and Castle A.C. of Section "B" have already qualified for the play-offs, with either McInerny or Moli Cafe making the fourth team.

Shinto, Uchima, and Takabayashi led the Riversider attack, each chalking up six points. However, McInerny's Mahukona copped high-scoring laurels by connecting for 10 points. Kumashiro, a team-mate, scored seven.

Moli Cafe remained in the running for the league championship by nipping McCully 33-27 in an exciting tussle. The game see-sawed until the closing moments when Moli Cafe pulled away behind brilliant shooting by W. Olsen. Olsen, incidentally, was high-scorer with 15 points. Uno, McCully forward, rang up 13 markers.

Castle A. C. swamped Desha Lane 35-11 with Meheula leading the offense. Meheula punished the meshes for 12 points, followed by team-mates Kinumatsu with nine, and Scharsch with eight.

The Mavericks buried Akepo Lane 51-17 to lower the curtain on the day's activities. Kam sparkled for the Mavericks by dumping in 19 points. Ja gave him brilliant support by manufacturing 17 digits.

Regular schedules for the 135# league will wind up this Sunday, December 11, with a five-game attraction beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Palama gym. The championship series will be staged immediately after.
