PALAMA WINS TEAM TROPHY IN FIVE-MILE RUN

Palama Settlement's road-running squad, coached by Louis Mendonca, moved into the top spot among local marathon clubs by scoring a scintillating victory in the annual Diamond Head five-mile jaunt sponsored by the YMCA on New Year's Day. The Pals copped third, fourth, fifth, sixth, and eighteenth places to gain the team trophy.

Walter Gouveia successfully defended his title, winning by 150 yards from Herb Scharsch of Citywide in 26 minutes, 31.1 seconds, nearly a minute slower than his record of 25:44.8 set last year. Norman Tamanaha paced the Palama champions into third position, followed by Albert Chun, William Bajadallis, and Louis Rocha in a compact unit. Manuel Perry completed the Palama five-man squad by crossing the finish line in sixteenth place.

Louis Rocha, who finished in sixth place, annexed a special trophy for being the first novice runner to complete the grind.

Gouveia won without much effort and was never seriously pressed throughout the race. The Waipahu Whippet displayed superb condition and proved conclusively that he is far and away the greatest middle-distance runner ever developed in the islands.

A great field of 65 runners started the race and 61 finished. All finishers cracked 40 minutes for the event, marking the first time in 15 years that such a feat has been accomplished. The Diamond Head classic is a fair indication of the comparative strength of teams entered in Palama Settlement's annual Around-Oahu Marathon Relay scheduled for Sunday, January 21, over an 84-mile course.

CASTLE A.C. CROWNED 135# CAGE CHAMPION

Diamond Packers 24; Crusaders 11 Castle A. C. 35; Vocats 23

Sylvester Abili's Castle A.C. cagers won Palama Settlement's 135# basketball league championship by whipping Edward Sumida's Honolulu Vocational School outfit 35-28 in the nightcap of a twin-bill Sunday, December 31, in the Palama gym. Diamond Packers walloped Abell's Crusaders 24-11 in the first game to gain runner-up bonors.

The twin-bill was the last of the round robin series between sectional winners to determine the league champions. Castle swept through the play-offs with three victories, flashing a fast-breaking attack and air-tight guarding to overcome the opposition. Diamond Packers scored two wins and Abell's Crusaders one. Honolulu Vocational failed to crash the victory column, but played sterling ball throughout the series. Castle A.C. and Honolulu Vocation represented "A" section, while Diamond Packers and Abell's Crusaders carried the "B" division banner.

As in previous tussles, a powerful second half rally proved the difference between winning and losing for Castle A.C. The Vocats battled Castle to a standstill in the first half, but wilted in the next period. Score at half-time was 18-17 in favor of Castle. Herb Scharsch chalked up 10 points and Kang eight for Castle to lead the Castle offense. Chun and Kim, with seven and six digits respectively, accorded them brilliant support. Tom and Takahashi matched Castle's stars point for point but were not backed by their team-mates. Tom registered 10 markers and Takahashi eight.

Carvalho sparked the Diamond Packers' triumph over Abell's Crusaders by coming through with 10 points. Rapoza and Martin were other stars for the Packers. The Crusaders were unable to find the meshes consistently, and their baskets were few and far between.
