

Point number TWO is about your instruments.

The average instrument such as a trombone, or a saxaphone, costs around \$100 to \$300 dollars. So you can understand why we

all must handle them carefully.

Matter of fact, the first few practice sessions will only be about how to handle the instruments...in and out of the case, putting the sections together, cleaning the mouthpiece and so on.

That makes sense because if the instrument is damaged from improper handling no one will be able to play it.



After you do get an instrument, don't let others handle it. Keep it out of reach of little brothers and sisters. There are a lot of little levers and valves that are very delicate:

ALSO.....No one else should blow through your mouthpiece. Germs! All Kinds of 'em hop from person to person by mouth. So keep your mouthpiece clean and don't let anyone else blow it!



Point Number THREE!

Somebody asked me if being in the band will cost any money.

The answer is this:

Besides your Palama

Membership Fee, the only
other thing you will need will
be to purchase your own mouthpiece. This will cost between
\$2.50 and \$4.50 and if you
take care of it, it will last
for years.

Your Band Instructor will tell you about this if he hasn't already.

Later on you will need a music notebook and pencil. The notebook costs about 30¢.....but later.

That's about all. If in future years you want to buy your own instrument we will be glad to advise you.
