TWO-STEP INN TRAMPLES EWA PLANTATION 21-7

Masuto Fujii's title-bound Two-Step Inn barefooters gained the undisputed West Section leadership of the Citywide-Palama 130# barefoot football league by scoring a brilliant 21-7 victory over Ewa Plantation Sunday, October 8, at Lanakila field. The victory was Two-Step Inn's fifth in a row and Ewa's first setback in four starts.

Goshima sparkled for Two-Step Inn by passing to Kotaka for 20 yards and a touch-down in the first quarter, and circling end for 37 yards and another score later in the same period. Tongo Tomita tallied for Two-Step in the fourth quarter on an off-tackle smash from Ewa's seven-yard line. The rurals registered in the third period when a roughing penalty put the oval on Two-Step Inn's one-yard marker from which point Ewa plunged over for a score.

Barbecue Inn flashed inspired ball to hold the Aiea Rams to a scoreless tie at Aiea, while Waipahu won on a default from the Pal Babes in a scheduled tussle at Castle field in the remaining West Section games.

Smile Cafe battled the favored Moiliili Neseis to a scoreless deadlock in the feature East Section tilt at Cartwright park. Waialae YMA staged a brilliant fourth-quarter rally to nip Lido Cafe 13-7, and Hinode Kai crushed Hui Makai 38-6 to end Eastside hostilities.

The idle Loo's Place squad remained on top in East Section with four victories and are heavy favorites to cop the sectional championship. Two-Step Inn must whip the tough Waipahu team to gain the West Section title.

League-director Henry Yamasaki announced the suspension of the Pal Babes for defaulting to Waipahu, and ruled the Westsiders' remaining tussles against Charlie Chan and Barbecue Inn forfeited.

PALS BOW TO SPARTAN WEIGHT-LIFTERS IN MEET

A picked squad of weight-lifters from the Spartan Club of Kapahulu bested Palama's strong-men in an exhibition last Wednesday evening in the Westside gym. The defending-champion B. K. Yamamoto outfit continued to challenge Tommy Wong's Pirates "B" for the top spot in Palama Settlement's 110# basketball league by swamping Toyo A. C. 26-7 in the first game of a twin-bill Tuesday evening, October 3, in the Westside gym. Both aggregations boast of clean slates, but Pirates "B" has chalked up four victories against three for B.K.Y. after five weeks of play.

Iha and Inouye sparked the B.K.Y. win by registering six points apiece. Lum was Toyo's best scorer with four markers.

Hui Imua won on a 2-0 default from Maggie's Inn in the second half of the scheduled double-attraction for its third victory of the season.

Toyo A. C. handed Pirates "A" their fourth straight defeat in whipping the Buccaneers 23-18 in the second game of Thursday's twin-bill. Nakasone with six points, Kato with six, and Chung with six, were largely responsible for Toyo's triumph. Wong led the Pirate attack with four markers.

Pirates "B" smothered the Raiders 42-19 in the opening tussle behind the fine sniping of Lo, Young, and Wee. Lo punished the meshes for 13 points, while Young tallied 10, and Wee nine digits. Koide again proved himself the whole show for the Raiders by chalking up nine markers.
