PALAMA TENNIS CLUB WINS CLASS "B" TITLE

Yoshiharu Nishida's Palama Tennis Club was awarded the "Section One" championship of the Class "B" Tournament following the granting of a 5-0 default-claim over Stewart's Pharmacy by the league president.

Stewart's Pharmacy was found guilty of violating the league rules when it failed to appear on scheduled time for matches against the Pals on Sunday, March 17.

Mack Lee's Pal Babes surprised a large gallery by whitewashing the Vagabonds 7-0 with Bob Kau on the mound. The Babes played heads-up ball throughout the tussle and accorded Kau fine support.

The Akepos scored a mild upset in taking Royal Malts 10-7. Six big runs in the 5th chapter enabled the Akepos to register the victory.

Charlie Chan chalked up its second consecutive victory by whipping the Westsidars 11-3 with Joie Rio again going great guns in the box. The Westsidars cracked wide open in the last two innings after threatening most of the way. Honolulu Chop Sui paced the Chans by nipping St. Theresa 4-3 in the closest game of the day.

Palama A.C. barely nosed out the Carabian Braves 5-4 to win its first game in two starts. Potent sticking and base-running proved deciding factors in the Pal victory. Waiaka continued to dominate Section "B" by walloping Castle "A" for its second triumph. Kaiulani handed Lakimela its second setback by coming through 9-2 and incidentally tie Waiaka. Desha Lane downed Castle "B" by virtue of a fine rally in the closing innings.

PALAMA CINDER STARS APPROACHING TOP FORM

Palama Settlement's senior track stars are approaching top form after a month of intensive practice under Charley Ornellas and Reed Maxson on the Alexander Field cinder-paths.

With the Rainbow Relays only four weeks away, the Pal mentors are trying to line-up dual meets with the University of Hawaii and Waimanalo A.C. to ascertain the strength and weaknesses of the team before the big meets in May.

This year's Palama squad is the smallest in many seasons with most of its strength concentrated in the middle-distances and pit events. The Pal coaches are anxious to bolster the sprint corps with promising youngsters.

INTER-CLUB INDOOR TRACK MEET HELD FRIDAY

The Boys' Department Inter-Club Indoor Track Meet was held last Friday, April 5, under the direction of Harry Lee and Raymond Choo in the Palama gym. Final tabulations of the results have as yet not been completed and will be published in the next issue of Kapalama.

Several outstanding individual performances were recorded in the competition, which embraced events and weight classes of the B.C.A. pentathlon. Daniel Meheula broad-jumped 9' 7" and registered 26' 1" in the hop, step, and jump for noteworthy performances in the Unlimited division. Another sterling feat was Manuel Maldonado's 22 pull-ups in the 80 pound class. Little Maldonado is only nine years old and his feat ranks with the greatest achievements of Palama's B.C.A. stars.

Points were given for five places in all events of the pentathlon, with the championship club slated to receive a trophy. Souvenir sweaters bearing a Palama emblem will be awarded individual champions.

JUNIOR REPUBLIC TRACK DATES ANNOUNCED
