The West Section will show Lido Cafe against Tony Gora at Lanakila Park and Hui Eleu stacking up with Charlie Chan at Castle Field in games slated for 10:00 a.m. Ewa is scheduled to tackle Aiea at 10:00 o'clock on the rural greensward, with Kalihi Kai barging into Waipahu at 1:30 p.m. to take on the country squad.

Action looms keener and faster this year with every team compelled to fully equip. their players and eliminate the bugaboo of injury. Mike Shizuru's charges again look like the money in East Section, while Masuto Fujii's Kyodo Kai outfit should be a cinch in West Section.
