The Music Department of Palama Settlement
has a project in which your Club might be interested.

Through a special "Scholarship Fund" established through the generosity of Mrs. Nesta Obermer and others music scholarships are made available to boys and girls of the Palama area. Many of our youngsters come from homes where the breadwinner does not bring home more than \$160 to \$180 a month. With four to five children in this type of family they cannot afford to pay for music - yet many of these children are very talented. It is also true that some of the "rough and tumble" kids of this neighborhood are influenced towards the more gentle life by their contact with our music program. Incidentally, we now have over 200 children in this program.

In order to provide scholarships for the many needy children that come to us we ask your help at this time. Perhaps this is just the kind of club project you have been looking for, I shall be very glad to come to your Club and discuss the project more fully at your earliest convenience.
