## INTER-CLUB INDOOR TRACK MEET SLATED FRIDAY

The Boys' Department will stage its big Inter-Club Indoor Track Meet this Friday, April 5, at 7:00 p.m. in the Settlement gymnasium. More than 200 youngsters are expected to participate in the five-event carnival which will embrace contests and rules listed under the B.C.A. Indoor Athletic Competition.

Points will be awarded for five places in every event and weight class in the pentathlon, and the club totaling the highest number of points will be awarded a trophy. Individual champions in all five weight divisions will be awarded souvenir sweaters for their achievements.

Events are the standing broad jump, running high jump, standing hop, step, and jump, l-minute basketball shoot, and pullups, with weights classified at 80#, 95#, 110#, 125#, and Unlimited.

The Inter-Club competition was scheduled by Club-Director Harry Lee to stimulate interest in the annual B.C.A. Indoor Track Meet, and to familiarize the Palama youngsters with the events.
