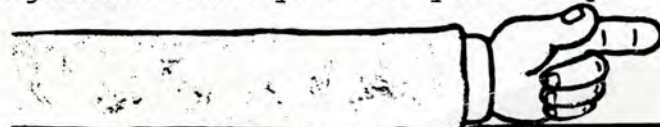


Mahalo Plenty!!
