SHERIDAN A. C. WINS 120 POUND CAGE TITLE

David Y. K. Akana 27; Onomichiya 21 Sheridan A. C. 42; ACA Juniors 26

Sheridan A.C. won Palama Settlement's 120 pound basketball league title Sunday, November 24, by taking ACA Juniors in its stride 42-26 before a large crowd in the Settlement gym. David Y. K. Akana blitz-krieged Onomichiya Hotel 27-21 in the preliminary to the big game.

Makoto Suto's presence in the line-up gave Sheridan A.C. the punch necessary to stem the hard-playing ACA Juniors. Suto teamed beautifully with Ino to wreck the Chinese cagers, tallying 13 points while Ino collected 14. Nishioka and Nishimi starred at guard for Sheridan A.C. Spectacular shooting by Philip Kam kept ACA in the ball game until the final quarter, when Suto and company turned the tussle into a rout. Kam clicked for 15 digits, but was given poor support by his team-mates.

Sheridan A.C. was presented with a beautiful gold trophy symbolic of the championship immediately after the titular battle. The champions played brilliant ball in the round-robin series between sectional winners, taking David Akana 28-12 and Onomichiya Hotel 26-11 in addition to the ACA Juniors.

PAL 135# BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP TO COMETS

Charlie Chan A.C. 48; Kaheka YMA 14 Comets 34; ACA Juniors 23

Coach Francis Kapahua's fast-breaking Comets won the 1940 Palama community-wide 135# basketball league championship by whipping ACA Juniors 34-23 in scintillating manner Monday, November 25, in the Westside gym. Charlie Chan A.C. gained runner-up honors by swamping Kaheka YMA 48-14 in the first game behind Manuel Silva's 30-point firing.

The Comets outclassed ACA Juniors in every department of play, with Charley Raymond and Given Goo pacing their attack. Raymond tallied 14 points while Goo garnered 10. Ernest Ching dumped in 13 points for ACA from a guard position, while James Chun hooped eight. The victory was the Comets' third straight in the round-robin championships and clearly demonstrated their superiority.

Silva's spectacular firing turned Charlie Chan's victory into a rout. Kaheka's sharp-shooters were impotent and its defense crumbled before the snappy passing and shooting of the Punchbowl cagers.
