SECTIONAL BAREFOOT CHAMPIONS CROWNED

Masuto Fujii's Tony Gora barefooters and Ben Ahakuelo's Moiliili Blues were crowned sectional champions in the City-wide-Palama 130# barefoot football league following the circuit's final tussles Sunday, October 20, on city and rural gridirons. Tony Gora routed Kalihi-Kai 27-0 to romp off with the West Section title, while Moiliili Blues garnered the East Section crown by virtue of a 12-0 victory over Waialae.

Tony Gora and Moiliili will meet for the Oahu championship Sunday, November 3, at the Honolulu Stadium. Both teams went through their schedule with unbeaten records, although Moiliili was tied once. Tony Gora registered five victories in as many starts, while Moiliili came through with six triumphs in seven games. A battle royal looms when the two outfits clash, with Masuto Fujii's Tony Goras doped to win.

Waipahu clinched a tie with Aiea for second spot in final West Section standings by walloping Charlie Chan 24-0, as Aiea whipped Hui Eleu 14-6 in scheduled tilts.

Palama Settlement's community-wide 120 pound and 135 pound basketball loops offered last tussles on Monday and Tuesday evenings of last week before large and rabid crowds in the Westside gym.

Charlie Chan A. C. opened 135 pound Section "A" activities with a scintillating 28-26 victory over Kaheka YMA in the first game of a twin-bill Monday, October 14. A. Martin sparked the Chan win by scoring 13 points, with Chang's six digits giving him fine support. Tanaka, Hisamura, and Yukinaga tallied six points each to keep Kaheka in the game.

Park Theater had an easy time whipping Akepos 22-9 in the second tilt of the evening. Eddie Wong, Aina, and Walter Wong starred offensively for the movie monguls, while Uyeno was the whole show for the Akepos.

ACA Juniors #3 scored an exciting 17-16 victory over Sheridan A.C. in the best game of a 120 pound Section "A" triple-attraction Tuesday, October 15, behind fine shooting by Kam and Chung. Kaiulani A.C. took ACA Juniors #1 for a 30-19 ride in the opening game with Nishimura and Komatsu each chalking up eight points. Fair Department Store walloped Park Theater in the remaining tangle, 26-21, by virtue of a fast breaking attack. Yogi led the Department Store quintet with 11 points, with Tagawa scoring six. Lee was hot for Park Theater with 10 digits.

Coach Peter Chun's classy ACA Juniors scored a brilliant 36-34 victory over a fast Comets outfit tutored by Francis Kapahua in the feature tussle of a Palama 135# Section "B" basketball twin-bill Thursday, October 17, in the Westside gym. Tanikawa Florist smashed Radio Appliances 43-28 in the second game.

The ACA-Comets tilt was nip and tuck all the way, with superior shooting in the clutches giving ACA Juniors a wide margin in the third quarter which a spectacular Comets rally barely failed to overcome. Henry Chang led the ACA attack by scoring 15 points and playing a bang-up floor game. James Chun, a team-mate, chalked up 12 points, four of them coming at crucial moments of the game. Charley Raymond and Given Goo each tallied 10 markers for the Comets.

Tanikawa Florist employed a tight man-to-man defense to crack the Korean attack. Big gunner of the Florists was Petrovitch, who scored 12 points. Kim scored nine, and Tong seven for Tanikawa. Yuen again proved himself Radio Appliances' ace by tallying 14 digits.

Onomichiya Hotel opened the 120# Section "A" schedule by whipping Takei Dry Goods 20-13 in the first game of a twin-bill Sunday, October 20. David Y.K. Akana subdued ACA Juniors #2 by a 29-19 margin in the second game.

Fukuda led the Onomichiya offense with seven points and was supported by Koide and Tokashike. Lum was Takei's best shot with four points. A strong second half rally enabled David Y. K. Akana to down the scrappy ACA Juniors #2 quintet. High scorer for the Akana cagers was Tom, who chalked up three baskets from a guard position. Lum and Ching each clicked for four points to aid Akana's cause. William Wun kept ACA Juniors in the ball game by dumping in seven markers and performing brilliantly on defense.
