Failure to find the basket in the wild closing minutes caused ACA's downfall.

Robert Chung's field goal with 30 seconds of play remaining in the game gave ACA Junior a scintillating 27-26 victory over a surprising Onomichiya Hotel outfit in the opening tussle of a 120# doubleheader Sunday, November 17. Onomichiya enjoyed a one-point lead with two minutes to go when ACA's Raymond Wong changed the score with a beautiful one-hander, but S. Koide retrieved it with less than a minute remaining in the game. Then came Chung's clincher. Chung scored eight points for ACA and Tokushige 10 for Onomichiya Hotel.

Sakuma's 16 points enabled Sheridan AC to rout David Y.K. Akana 28-12 in the second tilt of the morning. Ino and Nishimi each contributed five points toward Akana's first setback of the season. Sheridan A.C. defense bottled up Akana's artillery effectively throughout the hardfought tussle allowing Sum and Chang only four markers apiece. The remaining Akana sharp-shooters were impotent although they kept trying.

FLOYD FIELD TROPHY WON BY KOON SING LEE

Koon Sing Lee, smooth-working forward on the Tuxedo Shop outfit, was awarded the Floyd S. Field trophy for being the player who most closely emulated the virtues of the late Herbert "Bunny" Chung at a recent celebration held after the end of play in the ACA-sponsored Bunny Chung Memorial Basketball League.

As stipulated, the selection was made by a committee composed of the Recreation and Physical directors of Palama Settlement and the director of the league. Lee was a big reason why Tuxedo Shop finished in second place in the seven-team circuit. He was a hard, clean player and an outstanding example of Chinese-Americanism.

The award, the most distinctive in a bevy of 15 trophies, is a beautiful 18-inch basketball statuette donated as a gesture of friendship to Palama Settlement and as a tribute to an "esteemed friend and fellow associate."

While Recreation director of Palama Settlement several years ago, Mr. Field, now director of the Niagara Falls Boys' Club, served on committees with the late Bunny Chung in the Hawaiian Association of the AAU and in other activities. Mr. Chung was the founder of the ACA Club and a great all-round athlete.
