PALAMA INSTALLMENT PLAN

A pay-as-you-go plan has been initiated at Palama Settlement for those who are unable to pay their fees in one amount-\$2 for those 13 years and under

and \$4 for those 14 to 18 years.
The plan goes like this: A potential member pays 10 cents each time he visits and uses the facilities at the Settlement. He is then issued a temporary membership card for that day only. Payments of more than 10 cents makes it possible to get the year's membership card sooner but does not entitle the payer to more than one day's use at the Settlement.

When the \$2 or \$4 is accummulated, a permanent membership card will be issued which will be good for the balance of the year, starting with the date of the first payment.

No payment of less than 10 cents a day will be accepted in this part-payment plan.
