A lowly-rated John Hancock barefoot outfit coached by Harry "Rockne" Murakami provided the biggest upset of the two-week old Citywide-Palama 130# barefoot football league with a scintillating 12-0 victory over the heavily-favored Waialae team Sunday, September 15, at Cartwright field. All other favorites came through as expected in the eight-game schedule on city and rural gridirons.

Cocky from a moral scoreless victory over the defending-champion Charley's Place in its league debut a week ago, Waialae caught a tartar in the lowly John Hancocks, who had been trampled 13-0 by Hinode Kai in their first appearance. Murakami threw a touchdown pass to Yoshioka and Tateyama intercepted a Waialae toss for 60 yards and a score to register the upset.

Moiliili Blues clicked for its second win in taking Diamond Packers 6-0, Charley's Place swamped Primo Cubs 24-7, and Hinode Kai whipped Kaimuki 13-0 in other East Section tussles.

Masuto Fujii's fast-charging Tony Gora eleven shot into the driver's seat in West Section standings with a brilliant 22-14 decision over Alfred Espinda's Aiea Rams at Castle Field. Larry Nii sparked the Tony Gora victory with two fine scoring runs of 10 and 15 yards. Aiea's Tome thrilled spectators with a brilliant 60 yard return of a punt for a touchdown in the third quarter.

Kalihi Kai displayed power galore in downing Charlie Chan 18-0 at Lanakila Field, as Ewa stopped Hui Eleu Juniors 6-0 at Ewa, and Lido Cafe held Waipahu to a scoreless deadlock at Castle Field to round out scheduled West Section games.

The league will again offer eight tussles this Sunday, September 22.
