

BOYS' CLUBS TO SPONSOR CARNIVAL & CIRCUS

Members of Palama Settlement's Boys' Clubs, ranging in age from five years to young manhood, are concentrating every effort to put their big Carnival and Aerial Circus scheduled for June 30 and July 1 on the Settlement premises over with a bang. The Palama youths, in staging the events, have taken upon themselves to raise funds for the equiping and improving of their clubhouse, and incidentally, to show appreciation to the Settlement for its part in shaping their lives.

The Carnival and Aerial Circus will be the biggest single undertaking of the Boys' Recreation Department since its successful circuses of nearly a decade ago. All the color and revelry of the "Big Tent" will be featured and bally-hooed at the Settlement jubilee. Among the attractions and concession booths planned for the entertainment of the public are hilarious side-shows, dancing, pony rides, skill games of all varieties, and refreshments in the form of the usual hot dogs, popcorn, and soft drinks, plus laulau and poi, and saimin and barbecued meat.

A big parade through the Palama community is scheduled immediately before the grand opening of the Carnival. The American Legion, an organization vitally interested in youngsters, has offered its band for the creation of "atmosphere" at the two-day festival.

The Carnival is under the direction of Wilber S. Wood, Boys' Department head, and Harry Lee, Boys' Club-worker, and the Aerial Circus is being handled by Louis Mendonca and his gymnasts. Clubs working on the project are the Kalakaua Kings, Comrades, Fhat Choy, Pirates, Tigers, Elephants, Troop #30, Ravens, Junior Ramblers, Mavericks, Cub Pack #10, Swingsters, Salvation Army, Governors, Chipmunks, Hui Aliis, Castle, Batmen, and Elders Club.

WRECKERS WIN PAL SOFTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The hard-hitting Wreckers outfit won Palama Settlement's 1939 Softball championship by outclassing the Leaders 16-2 before a fine turnout in the finals of the titular play-offs Sunday, June 18, at Castle field.

Simeon Santiago graced the mound for the Wreckers and was in brilliant form. His team-mates accorded him air-tight support afield and spectacular stick-work at the plate. George Rio, the losing pitcher, was erratic and wild.

The Wreckers opened the game with a six-run spree which just about broke the Leaders' hearts. From the first inning on, the Wreckers were invincible, scoring two runs in the third chapter, two in the fifth, and three each in the eighth and ninth frames while holding the Leaders to two tallies in the fourth.

A sparkling 15-7 victory over Elders Club Sunday, June 11, gave the Wreckers the right to meet the Leaders for the league championship. The Leaders drew the bye in the single elimination series between champions of the three sections of the 25-team circuit, automatically qualifying for the finals. The Wreckers were Section "A" champions, Elders Club represented "B" Section, while the Leaders carried the "C" Section hopes.

The champions were presented with a beautiful gold trophy immediately following the tussle, and the Leaders were given the runner-up silver statuette.
