MUSIC SCHOOL REPORT
JUNE 1950

June was a very erratic month full of extremes. It was a month that hit high and low peaks in both activity and enrollment.

For activity June began with a bang on June 3 with the Potluck Jamboree which was a great success. The next event was the closing exercises for the school year 1949-1950. Included on the program was a recital by the advanced students and demonstrations of class activities by representative classes from the youngest student of five years to the oldest student of the Music for the Community class, which is made up of mothers and other adults. Mrs. Hitchcock gave a brief report of the Jamboree. Awards for perfect attendance and high scholarship were presented by Mrs. Watkins. A reception climaxed the event.

For low ebb of activity the students were on vacation for two weeks, June 12-24. For the faculty and staff it was registration and entrance examination week. During these two weeks the pianos were tuned.

With the beginning of the summer term activity took up a fast pace again. Enrollment climbed to almost twice its present status. New classes were added to the Curriculum to adjust to the short eight-week summer term. These were: Music for the Young, Mixed Glee, (elementary grades), Conducting and Scorerereading for three different age groups, and Piano Ensemble. Private lessons in both piano and voice were continued as well as the Girls' Glee Club and one preparatory theory class.
