

WALNUT COOKIES

cup soft butter 1 cups flour 1 cup powdered sugar 1 beaten egg to cup chopped walnuts

Mix butter and flour. Then add sugar and beaten egg and knead. Mix in chopped nuts and roll with your fingers into little balls and place on greased baking

Mash with floured fork, straight across and then up and down, making little balls flat.
