







WALNUT COOKIES

1 cup soft butter 1½ cups flour
1 cup powdered sugar 1 beaten egg
½ cup chopped walnuts

Mix butter and flour. Then add sugar and beaten egg and knead. Mix in chopped nuts and roll with your fingers into little balls and place on greased baking sheet.

Mash with floured fork, straight across and then up and down, making little balls flat.

Bake 5 to 7 minutes in a hot oven. When cool, the cookies will be crisp and crunchy. Nice with cold milk! Yum, yum, yum.
