CASINO AND ACA TIED FOR 110# CAGE TITLE

Joe Lau's defending-champion ACA Jrs. #2 and Donald Kim's Casino Brown Cats are tied for the championship of Palama Settle ment's 110# basketball league following completion of the regular schedule last week in the Westside gym. Both outfits have won five games in six starts and will battle for the 1940 title Tuesday, October 8, at 7:00 o'clock.

Park Theater required two extra periods to subdue Onomichiya Hotel 36-35 in the hottest tussle of a triple-attraction Tuesday, October 1. Score at the end of regular play was 29-29 and 33-33 at the first over-time gun. Starring for Park Theater was Issac Lum, who tallied 10 points, and Al Lee, who came through with timely baskets. Iwamoto was the whole show for Onomichiya, chalking up 18 markers and playing a bang-up floor game.

ACA Juniors #2 assured themselves of at least a tie for the championship by swamping the Spartans 32-16 behind George Chu's 11 points. Kanehira scored eight for the Spartans. Casino Brown Cats took a stubborn ACA Juniors #1 squad by a 22-12 margin with Given Goo's 14-point barrage paving the victory. The ACA Juniors battled valiantly but were unable to stop the sharp-shooting Casino ace.

The Casino Brown Cats tied ACA Juniors #2 for the league championship with a scintillating 33-30 victory over Onomichiya Hotel Thursday, October 3. Playing without Given Goo, the Brown Cats were hard-put to take Onomichiya, but superior reserves earned them the game. Lee, Pang, Young, and Wee scored heavily for Casino while Uyehara sparkled for Onomichiya. Injuries and illness forced Mishima Fender to default to ACA Juniors #2 in a scheduled tussle. Park Theater featured in another one-point victory in nipping the Spartans 24-23 in the last game of the regular schedule.

MOILIILI BLUES TAKE CHARLEY'S PLACE 7-0

A fighting band of Blue Devils from Moiliili blasted Mike Shizuru's defending-champion Charley's Place from the titular picture of the Citywide-Palama 130# barefoot football league with a brilliant 7-0 victory in the most significant tussle of an eight-game attraction Sunday, October 6, on city and rural gridirons. Yamada intercepted a lateral pass late in the fourth quarter and packed it 85 yards for a touchdown to give Moiliili a victory and the driver's seat in East Section standings. Nakano place-kicked the extra point.

Diamond Packers kept within striking distance of Moiliili by taking Harry Murakami's John Hancock giant-killers 14-0 behind spectacular ball-toting by Ernest Pacheco. Pacheco struck paydirt twice, from John Hancock's two-yard line in the second quarter, and from the eight-yard stripe in the third period. Hinode Kai trampled Primo Cubs 33-0 to chalk up the most decisive victory of the season, and Kaimuki won a moral scoreless victory over Waialae in other East Section skirmishes.

Coach Masuto Fujii's powerful Tony Gora machine took a strangle hold on the West Section championship by steam-rolling Charlie Chan 25-0 for its fifth consecutive victory. The Tony Goras are the class of the circuit and are almost surefire bets to cop the sectional championship. Waipahu retained a mathematical Tony Gora by chopping Hui Eleu 20-6 at Waipahu. The rural barefooters scored at every opportunity and were never threatened by the Green Wave. Kalihi-Kai upset Ewa 13-6 in a story-book finish when Hamamura passed 30-yards to Okazaki for a touchdown in the last play of the game. Lido Cafe and Aiea battled through four quarters to a scoreless tie to end West Section hostilities.

PAL 135# CAGE LOOP TO OPEN ACTION THURSDAY

Palama Settlement's community-wide 135# basketball league will open its 1940 season with a fast twin-bill Thursday, October 10, in the Westside gym. Esther Malt Shop is scheduled to tackle the Koreans in the league opener at 6:30 p.m., with the Comets meeting Tanikawa Florist at 7:15 o'clock.

The 120# league will swing into play with a scheduled double-attraction Sunday, October 13, when Nomads A.C. collides with ACA Juniors #1 at 9:00 a.m., and Onomichiya Hotel stacks up against Takei Dry Goods at 9:45 o'clock.

Twenty teams are entered in the popular Westside circuits, 11 in the 120# division, and nine in the 135# bracket. Each league is divided into two sections each, with sectional champions and runners-up slated to play a round-robin series for the league-titles.

Section "A" 135# clubs are Charlie Chan A.C., Kaheka YMA, Park Theater, and Akepos; with the Koreans, Tanikawa Florist, Comets, Esther Malt Shop, and ACA Juniors comprising the "B" Section. Grouped in "A" Section of the 120# league are ACA Juniors #1, Kaiulani A.C., Fair Department Store, Sheridan A.C., ACA Juniors #3, and Park Theater; while ACA Juniors #2, Takei Dry Goods, Onomichiya Hotel, Nomads A.C., and David Y.K. Akana are listed in Section "B".

Castle A.C. and Palms A.C., 135# and 120# champions respectively last year, will not defend their championships, leaving the race wide open.
